4. Chairman's, Borough Councillors and Clerks Reports

Cllr Gannon reported the defibrillator was now installed and should be operational in 24hrs. A training schedule to be discussed at the next meeting. There will be a sign to say who provided it and thanks to the Rapid Relief Team.
